### Mandatory Units

**Unit 1.** Be able to assess the learning environment and learner(s) to identify and reduce the risk of injury prior to and during a physical skills learning programme

**Unit 2.** Be able to understand and manage a safe learning environment and maintain the appropriate dynamics for the delivery of physical skills and interventions

**Unit 3.** Be able to demonstrate, instruct and coach learners in physical skills practices in an appropriate learning environment

**Unit 4.** Be able to assess learner's ability in the application of physical skills using various methods.

### The L2 – PI for the Private Security Industry

1. Understand physical interventions and the legal implications of their use
2. Understand and explain methods and processes that reduce the risk of harm before, during and after a physical intervention
2. Be able to use relevant physical skills to reduce the risk of harm and protect yourself and others from assault
3. Show the ability to use restrictive and non restrictive skills and techniques, for holding and escorting purposes in a non aggressive manner
